Dr Aisling Carr is a Consultant Neurologist at the Centre for Neuromuscular Diseases, National Hospital of Neurology and Neurosurgery, Queen Square, London She is Honorary Clinical Lecturer UCL, JNNP associate editor (neuromuscular), British Peripheral Nerve Society treasurer.

Research themes: Inflammatory neuropathies, Biomarkers in neuropathy, Neurotoxicity of checkpoint inhibitor chemotherapies

Dr Carr was appointed to her position in 2016 after completing a clinical fellowship in Peripheral Nerve disease. Her undergraduate training was in Trinity College Dublin, followed by general medical and Neurology specialty post-graduate training in Northern Ireland. She developed clinical and research interest in neuromuscular diseases via an MSc in myology in the Salpetriere hospital in Paris and a PhD in Myasthenia epidemiology between Queens University Belfast and Oxford. Her current clinical practice specialises in peripheral nerve and neuro-inflammatory disease. She leads the neuromuscular intravenous immunoglobulin service in NHNN, runs the Pan-London cancer immunotherapy neurotoxicity service and sits on the national Hemophagocytic Lymphohistocytosis MDT.

Dr Carr is NHNN PI/ UK CI on two phase2/3 clinical trials of novel immunological therapeutic molecules in CIDP and MMN. Her primary research interest is in inflammatory myopathy biomarker development and pathogenesis. She has active collaborative clinical research projects in haematooncology-neuropathy and immune-checkpoint inhibitor associated neurotoxicity.
