The Diagnostic Journey: A Neurological Point of View with Professor Sinead Murphy MB BCh MD FRCPI, Consultant Neurologist, Tallaght University Hospital.

Professor Sinéad Murphy is a Consultant Neurologist at TUH and Clinical Associate Professor in Trinity College Dublin. She has particular subspecialty interest and expertise in inherited neuropathies and ataxias, runs Neuropathy and Neuromuscular clinics and co-leads the National Ataxia Clinic in Tallaght University Hospital (TUH). She is lead of the Irish Consortium for Rare Neurological Disorders, with TUH recently being recognised as a site for the European Reference Network in Rare Neurological Diseases (ERN-RND). She chaired the Neurology sub-group of the HSE Amyloidosis Working Group which developed the Amyloidosis Model of Care.

Professor Sinead Murphy will explore the diagnostic journey for a Rare Disease from the neurological and professional point of view.

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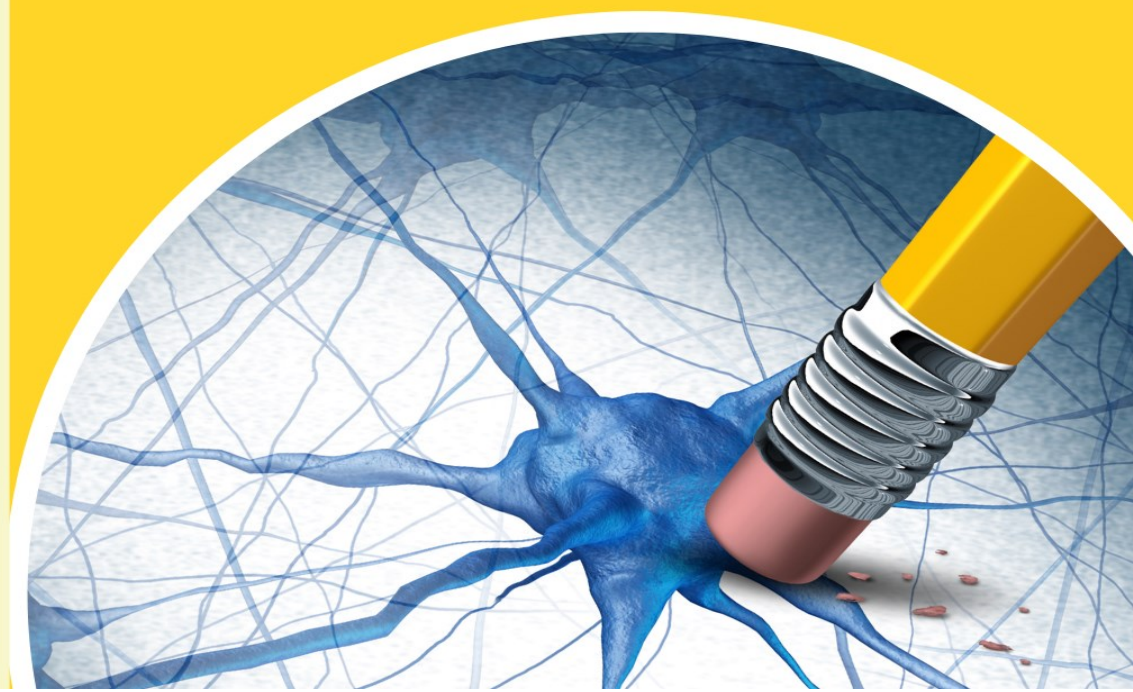
