Dr. PATRICK NICHOLSON is a neurointerventional radiologist at Beaumont Hospital, Dublin. He trained in Ireland before completing subsequent fellowships in both diagnostic and interventional neuroradiology in Toronto Western Hospital. After his training he joined the team there as a consultant neuroradiologist and associate professor at the University of Toronto, where he was a member of a group that performed several 'world first' surgeries and procedures. After six years in Toronto, he recently returned to Dublin to join the team in Beaumont. One of his main clinical and research interests is the imaging and treatment of CSF disorders including intracranial hypotension and IIH. He continues to collaborate with international research groups and has published >100 papers in the speciality.
